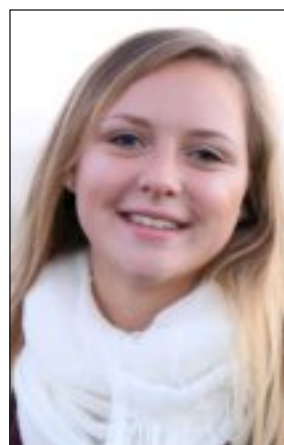
for the Ocean Wave Quilters. Each quilter picked a
