Living in the breathtakingly beautiful yet highly remote Mendocino Coast, requires significant dependence on technology for communication. Yesterday morning we lost cell service, internet access, connectivity to telephone landlines faxes, television, and a host of support tools. The communication outage, caused by an independent contractor cutting through fiber optic lines a few miles away, resulted in the hospital and thousands of coastal residents being off the grid for more than 20 hours. To make matters even more complex, 911 was not available. Fortunately, safe patient care was not interrupted despite having only a single satellite phone, which could only be used outside under clear skies! With local pharmacies and other services curtailed due to the communication break, people began showing up at the hospital for information and resources. Thankfully, police, fire, city, schools, county and the hospital immediately joined together in providing calm to the community. Our staff went to the homes of dozens of elderly patients to help ensure their safety. Last night, through a single satellite phone, and the help of our sister hospital. located an hour away over a treacherous mountain road, communication was sent to a helicopter to assist with a patient transfer late at night. Staff stayed to work extra shifts and some spent the night at the hospital knowing that when phones don't work, there is no way of calling in extra help. It was beautiful to watch neighbors take care of neighbors. The world is filled with good people, we happen to have a lot of them on the Mendocino Coast

Rotary International Interact clubs bring together young people ages 12 to 18 to develop leadership skills while discovering the power of "Service Above Self". These clubs must participate in two projects every year, one that helps their school or community and one that promotes international understanding. Club member, Tim Bosma introduced five of the members of the Fort Bragg High School Interact Club. This year this club is in the rebuilding mode, after being cancelled for two years, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The number of members slowly increased as the school year progressed. Their goal is to recruit more members next year. The club has been working together with other members of our community to do yardwork in the new Lincoln Street Community Garden and the gardens of the Noyo Food Forest. A few members helped our club with this year's Drive Through Crab Feed. This year's president is senior Dylan Hutchinson, who will be majoring in next fall in Environmental Science at Pitzer College (one of the seven Claremont Colleges in southern California patterned after the Oxford-Cambridge collaborative model). Holiday Barrett is finishing up her sophomore year and will become next year's Interact president. Avery Epperson is also currently in the tenth grade and will be Vice President of FBHS student body in the fall. Alyson Sanchellanez is a sophomore and Elena Caranicolas is in the ninth grade. For the past few years Tim Bosma and Cesar Yanez have been our club's sponsors that have put in a lot of time and effort to mentor and guide interactors as they carry out community service and develop leadership skills. It was a pleasure to meet and talk with such a diverse group of young women.


